Returning to In-person Worship Soon

We are excited to announce the return of indoor worship services in the sanctuary! The projected start date is Sunday, March 7, 2021 at 10:30am. This is a projected date because the number of COVID-19 cases in our area may require a slightly later start date. It is our hope that COVID-19 cases will continue to drop, and we feel that meeting together in-person, while not risk-free, is an acceptable option when using the appropriate safety measures detailed below.

Online worship services will continue to be available, and those who do not feel comfortable gathering in person are encouraged to worship at home. We will be livestreaming the sanctuary services, and those as home can participate in real-time on Sundays at 10:30.

SAFETY MEASURES AND GUIDELINES

- Those who feel sick and those who are awaiting test results for COVID-19 or have a positive diagnosis must stay home.
- Those who cannot safely wear a face covering should stay home (including children under 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone who is unable to remove the mask without assistance)
- Those who are in a vulnerable age category, live with vulnerable persons, or have pre-existing conditions are encouraged to stay home.

Those in attendance, *including those who have already been vaccinated*, will be <u>required to understand and follow these safety</u> guidelines:

- Face coverings are required
- Distance of 6ft between household groups is required
- No group singing
- Designated entrances and exits
- Limited access to the rest of the building
- Nursery will not be provided
- Attendance will be taken
- Reservations are strongly recommended

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Little Free Pantry

Our Little Free Pantry, located on Maple Street near the Neighborhood Center, functions to "fill the gaps" in food supply for those in our community, and it needs replenishing. Below is a list of items that can be donated by placing them directly into the pantry box or dropping them off at the church office.

Non-Perishable Foods (pull-tab/pop-top cans preferred): canned fruits & vegetables, canned meat & fish products (ravioli, tuna, corned beef, spaghetti, etc.), canned beans (all types), canned soups, boxed pasta (mac & cheese, hamburger helper, noodles), rice, cereals, granola bars, peanut butter, powdered milk, packaged drinks (hot chocolate, tea, juice boxes, water, etc.), healthy kid snacks (crackers, nuts)

Hygiene Items: soap, deodorant, shampoo, toilet tissue (individual rolls), toothpaste, toothbrush, **NO razor blades**
