Project teams will meet immediately after the breakfast and kick-off service in Fellowship Hall to join their groups and start to serve.

Service Opportunities: (all projects begin @ 10:00)

Clare's Closet: (Top floor of the Neighborhood Community Center – Steve & Novice Gross, Project Managers). Volunteers will prepare the room for coat distribution on October 31. They will organize coats, jackets, mittens & gloves into sizes. Some volunteers may go to pick up coats at collection points and distribute flyers to advertise the distribution.

One Acre Café: (Located on site at the Café, 603 W. Walnut Street – Aimee & Anthony Aiken, Project Managers). Volunteers will be doing a fall cleaning, particularly in the kitchen, under the direction of One Acre Café staff. This will include a thorough cleaning of the equipment, counters, food storage areas, etc.

Food Pantry: (First floor of the Neighborhood Community Center – Peggy Humphreys & Polly Crowder, Project Managers). Volunteers will assist with food distribution to area residents in need of food. This will include packing boxes, carrying items to cars, talking with residents and assisting in other ways the pantry can use your help. (See list of pantry needs on the back of this brochure).

Laundromat Love: (Wash-A-Rama, 1003 S. Roan St. (at the end of Pine St. next to the Roadrunner Market – Bree Nelson & Cathie Rosecrance, Project Managers). Volunteers will be present at the Laundromat to put quarters into machines for residents of the community who are there to wash their clothes. This is an opportunity to speak with residents and to get to know them better through conversation. Volunteers may offer to help with laundry to enjoy further conversation. This is a project mainly for adults but we would like to incorporate 1st Church children to be a part of the project as well.

South Side School (Project #1): (This takes place at the school, 1011 Southwest Ave. – Ernest Campbell, Project Manager). This is a maintenance project outdoors. Volunteers will scrape, stain and seal the gable ends of the pavilion while other volunteers will power-wash the concrete

deck of the pavilion. We will also wash down and power-wash the playground equipment.

South Side School: (Project #2) This takes place inside the school building at 1011 Southwest Ave. – Kathy Deakins, Project Manager). This is an artistic project in which volunteers will put up verses and lettering familiar to children on the interior wall of the school. Some of these are sayings from Dr. Seuss and other familiar authors. Principal, Ann Littleford, will also be present during this time for any questions about the work.

Parsonage: (1805 Fairway Dr. – Ernest Campbell – Project Manager). Volunteers will do painting and yard work to prepare for sale.

Yard Clean-up: (At a home located on Spring Street – Drew Cradic, Project Manager). Volunteers will mainly be our high school youth group but we need a few adult volunteers to work with them. Work will include cleaning out a garden bed that has become overgrown, trimming bushes and hedges and removing creeping vines from the house that are growing up the siding. An adult that owns and can operate a chainsaw is needed to remove two small trees. Bring what yard tools you have.

Lunch Preparation: (Located in the Fellowship Hall – Adults & Children grades K thru 4th grade - Project Manager, Kati Uelhof). Lunches will be prepared for project volunteers at all project sites. Adult volunteers are needed to help and teach younger children how to pack lunches. Drivers are also needed to distribute lunches to the worksites. Supplies of lunch bags, sandwich bags, napkins and food items will be needed and a few coolers for drinks.

Cookie Bake: (Located in the church kitchen – Adults and children grades 5 thru 8th grade – Pam Heaton Project Manager; Jamee Roberts, Assistant). Volunteers will bake cookies and pack and deliver them to Magnolia Ridge and the Manna House.

Early Learning Center: (Located at the church. Kathie Batista Project Manager), Volunteer will plant a tree and flowers, yard clean-up and clean window wells.

Nursing Home Visitation: (Meet in Fellowship Hall, Bill Carter, Project Manager) Go to area nursing homes and assisted living centers where our church members and friends live.

Child Care Workers: (Located in the church nursery or other designated area – Bree Nelson, Project Mgr). Adults will provide child care for infant children thru Pre-K so that younger parents can be involved in projects.
