GREETING

CALL TO WORSHIP

Leader: The Lord said: I am the Lord your God. I brought you out of Egypt. That is the land where you were slaves.

People: **Do not make statues of gods that look like anything in the sky, or on the earth, or in the waters.**

Leader: Do not bow down to them or worship them.

People: **Their images are shams. They are not alive.**

Leader: The Lord is the True God: the everlasting King.

People: **With great joy, we will worship the living God.**

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Leader: Merciful God, we come before You this day keenly aware of the ways we fall short of Your vision for us and for our life together.

People: **In Your gracious presence, we confess our sin and the sin of the world.**

Leader: Although Christ is among us as our peace, we are a people divided against ourselves as we cling to the values of a broken world.

People: **The fears and jealousies that we harbor set neighbor against neighbor and nation against nation.**

Leader: We abuse Your good gifts of imagination and freedom, of intellect and reason, and turn them into bonds of oppression.

People: **We pay homage to things we acquire and protect, forgetting that You are the source of all that is good, and perfect, and eternal.**

Leader: Lord, have mercy on us.

People: **Heal and forgive us, Lord. Set us free to serve You in the world as agents of Your reconciling love.**

(silent reflection)

Leader: Our righteousness is found in Christ alone, a gift of God by faith. Beloved people of God, believe the good news of the gospel:

People: **Through the grace of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven. Thanks be to God. AMEN**
